IS CONSTRUCTION STABLE?

Construction is stable with a solid career path for all levels of interest whether it's hands-on working or working in an office environment. Emerick has remained very stable with their market share with average tenure over 16 years.

IS THE MONEY GOOD?

The commercial construction industry that Emerick specializes in pays very well and has full benefit packages that include medical, dental, and retirement. For example, the average annual wage for a carpenter in the United States is \$58.000 (U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics). Construction jobs are available immediately after High School meaning instead of incurring higher education debt there is an opportunity to make money right from the beginning.

CAN I MAKE A CAREER IN CONSTRUCTION?

Almost all construction firms look for long time career-orientated employees. Emerick, with its stable workload, is always looking for career-orientated individuals that want a challenging and rewarding career.

WHAT ADDITIONAL SCHOOLING DO I NEED TO DO WELL IN CONSTRUCTION?
